"In the future days, which we seek to make secure, we look forward to a world founded upon four essential human freedoms.


The first is freedom of speech and expression - everywhere in the world.

Herts Lynx - A Happy Traveller

I've lived in Hinxworth for nearly 15 years, during this time I've had to depend on my parents or grandparents for getting me to and from any events taking place outside of the village. The HertsLynx has been a game changer for me, I can now order an 'on-demand' bus to lots of places across Hertfordshire. So far I've only been to Letchworth and Baldock but I do plan to go much further afield soon.

The process is really easy. You can call $01992\ 555513$ or download the app. Simply go into the app and select where you want to go and when. Payment is all via the app. There are rates for anyone with a concessionary pass, everyone else pays a different rate depending on the distance travelled (this is capped at £5.00).

The service runs from 07.00 - 19.00 on Monday to Saturdays and from 10.00 - 16.00 on Sundays. You can book in real-time or in advance.

Book Review

A Single Thread By Tracy Chevalier


Tracy Chevalier evokes the social climate of the nineteen thirties It is 1932, and Violet is one of the "surplus women", left behind after losing her brother and her fiancé in the First World War. This was a unique generation of women, "considered a tragedy, and a threat", being men-less.

Violet leaves her mother to live independently in Winchester, supporting herself by working in an insurance office. Violet's life in Winchester has come at a cost and the narrative thread follows her struggles to assert her independence against the conventions and prejudices of the day.

Violet joins the Cathedral Broderers who are making kneelers and cushion covers for the cathedral. The real-life head-broderer Louisa Pesel plays a part, and we learn much about embroidery and about bell-ringing through Violet's developing friendship with Arthur, a bell-ringer.

The portraits of individual women in the story capture our attention; those who either pursue their freedom in small acts of disobedience, or quietly stitch their loss into comfort and beauty.

A Single Thread is an easy and enjoyable read; a gentle exploration of a bygone time. It is lovely.
