NOTES FROM OUR OCTOBER MEETING

- -Two new members joined the group Tracey Potter (Bassingbourn Parish Council) and Bob Davis (Guilden Morden).
- -We are fully staffed and are due to welcome a prescribing nurse whose additional skills will be very beneficial to patients. Also on Thursdays we enjoy the services of a physiotherapist at Ashwell.
- As everyone knows our outdated phone system is just not fit for purpose. We have been waiting a long time for the NHS to finance a new setup. At last it seems the funding is in the pipeline. Our practice Manager Katie thinks it will be in place in the new year.
- Our report on the Patient Survey has been available on the practice website since the beginning of September and we hope to make paper copies available in the waiting rooms and local pharmacies in due course. Many if not most of the problems identified arise from issues with the phone and the new system should resolve many of these (fingers crossed!). Appointments are now for 15 minutes and patients can request either a telephone or in-person consultation. Some chairs with arms have been placed in both waiting rooms to assist patients with mobility problems. All being well you won't need to wrap up so warmly while you wait for your winter appointment as the heating system is due for a welcome overhaul in mid-November.
- One patient queried why the surgery is relatively empty on occasions. Dr Jarvis gave 3 reasons for this 1) appointments are for specific times so there shouldn't be long waits; also they are staggered to keep. 2) numbers down to avoid germs being spread; and 3) our doctors and nurses spend part of their time dealing with phone and e-consult contacts which do not require a patient to be present.

A second query was whether there are too many means of contacting the surgery, making work for the staff and increasing the risk of things getting lost or overlooked. Our Practice Manager agreed with these observations and said that there is a national move to streamline patient contacts. In our report we asked patients not to use email. This is work in progress.

- For some time now patients have been able to contact the surgery electronically originally by eConsult and now via Accurx. You access this through the website and this enables you for instance to describe your symptoms after which a doctor will make contact. This service is only available at certain times however because doctors need to fit these communications in with in-person consultations and other duties.
- Our Practice Manager has established a link with Ashwell Primary School and will seek to do likewise with other schools in our patch. A welcome move!

We next meet in January.

Hinxworth Christmas Tree Comes to the Three Horseshoes


Christmas Eve - We have kindly been donated a Christmas tree by Tony Bony which will be outside the front of the pub throughout December.

DRAFT MINUTES OF A MEETING OF HINXWORTH PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL ON THURSDAY 2nd NOVEMBER 2023 AT 7.00 PM.

Present: Mr N. Tiffin (Chairman), Mr R. Cobb (Vice- Chairman), Mr T Lloyd, Mr A. Dawson & Mrs W. Kitchener (Clerk)

Other person present: Tom Tyson District Councillor.

Apologies: Steve Jarvis Hertfordshire County Councillor,

- I. The Minutes of the last meeting: The minutes of the meeting of 5 th October were agreed by the Parish Councillors. Proposed by Tony Lloyd and seconded by Tony Dawson.
- 2. Matters arising not elsewhere on the Agenda. Nothing to report.
- 3. Correspondence: Uncontested Elections: Notification has been received from North Herts District Council of a charge likely to be made for uncontested elections and asking for views of the Councillors on this. For Hinxworth the charge would be £250.00 at a cost to the Parish. The Councillors do not agree with this and have notified NHDC accordingly.
- 4. Finance: Current Parish Council Funds: The Councillors agreed to the expenditure for the current month. Proposed by Nick Tiffin and seconded by Tony Lloyd.
- 5. Planning: Planning Consultations:

Application 23/02232/FP Farrowby Farm, New Inn Road, Hinxworth. The Councillors agreed to "no objection" to this application.

The War Memorial: The Parish Council, having discussed some proposed refurbishment work to the War Memorial with NHDC Planning Department, Mark Simmons has responded that the work planned will not require a planning application so can start to prepare quotes for the work, it is hoped to commence these repairs within six to nine months when the weather improves.

6. Highways: Grass Cutting: The grass edges in New Inn Road have been cut.

Traffic Calming Feasibility Study: Plans from Hertfordshire Highways for phase two of the traffic calming project have been received by the Parish Council. The Councillors have some concerns regarding these as they, in their opinion, do not meet the requirements of the Village. Hertfordshire Highways have been notified and a response is, we hope, forthcoming.

7. Village Hall: Manhole Cover: The manhole cover alongside of the Village Hall will be replaced as soon as the weather improves.

Safety Measures: The Councillors have been notified that there could be a danger for young children when leaving the Village Hall after their activities. The youngsters tend to run along the side of the Hall and into the road going down the side of the hall, this is a blind spot where vehicles leaving the car park are unable to see them. So the Councillors agreed to install a post and rail fence from the hall corner to the path to improve visability This should provide a safety measure for the youngsters and give traffic leaving the car park more time to react if someone is entering the road.

8. Recreation Ground: Ashwell Accies: The Councillors have received a request for the use of the recreation ground on a Saturday morning by the young footballers. Further discussions need to be had regarding this request.

The Gate/Pedestrian Entrance: Connor Methven hopes to commence the work as soon as the weather improves.

- 9. The Tennis Court: Nothing to report.
- 10. Allotments: The Allotment Group: The committee are starting to pull together their proposed plans and associated costs for the allotment.
- II. Any Other Urgent Business: The War Memorial Clock: A date from A.J. James of Saffron Walden is awaited.

Street Sign Replacement Initiative: Tom Tyson reported any street signs that are in poor condition can be replaced. These will be supplied by NHDC. The Councillors will provide Tom with the photographs of those signs that require replacing.

John Mills: The Parish Councillors wish to send their condolences to the Mills family on the recent passing of John Mills the renowned sculptor.
