Stolen money returned to Hertfordshire scam victim

A vulnerable Hertfordshire resident who was scammed out of £18,500 by a fraudster, posing as a police officer, has been reimbursed by their bank. The victim was contacted in April 2022 by a phone call from someone claiming to be a police officer, who said they were investigating fraudulent activity on the victim's bank account. The fraudster asked the victim if they could withdraw cash from their account and check the serial numbers on the notes. The victim was instructed to stay on the phone whilst withdrawing the cash and told to take the money to a nearby car park, where it was collected by a man driving a delivery van.

The scammer contacted the victim two more times during April and May 2022, again instructing them to withdraw more cash and hand it over to a waiting courier.

The fraud was investigated by Hertfordshire Constabulary's Serious Fraud and Cyber Unit, whilst the Victim Support Team worked with the victim. Following a referral to the Financial Ombudsman, the victim was refunded in full by their bank.

Detective Inspector Pete Hankins, from the Serious Fraud and Cyber Unit, said: "We have seen a reduction in the number of reports of this type of courier fraud over the last year, but we believe there is still a significant number of residents who are being targeted by this type of scam. "Fraudsters use different stories to convince people they are genuine, the important thing to remember is that police officers or bank staff would never ask for people's bank details, like a PIN, or for cash to be handed over. You should never give your bank details to anyone. Usually the intended victim realises the call is not genuine and refuses to part with their details or cash. However, these fraudsters can be very persuasive and insistent, which has resulted in some people falling victim to this scam and subsequently losing thousands of pounds from their accounts."

If you receive a call you're not expecting, you should be suspicious. The vital things to remember are that your bank and the police would:

NEVER ask for your bank account details or PIN number over the phone, so do not disclose these to anyone, no matter who they claim to be.

NEVER ask you to withdraw money and send it to them via a courier, taxi or by any other means.

NEVER ask you to send your bank cards, or any other personal property, to them via courier, taxi or by any other means.

If you are not happy with a phone call and are suspicious of the conversation you have with the caller then please end the call and dial 101 or report online. Remember, when reporting a suspicious phone call to police, wait at least five minutes before attempting to make the call to ensure you're not reconnected to the offender.

Alternatively, use a mobile phone or test your landline by phoning a friend or relative first, to ensure you aren't still unwittingly connected to the offender. If you have concerns about your bank account, visit your local branch.

Appeal to trace driver from the A505

Police are appealing for witnesses of motorists to trace the driver of a Ford Puma, as part of enquiries into an incident on the A505 in Baldock.

The incident occurred at around 5.40am on Saturday 20 May.

It is reported that a blue Audi Q5 was seen being driven carelessly and being inconsiderate to other road users.

PC Ian Gould, who is investigating, said: "Our enquiries are continuing, and I am urging anyone with information to please come forward.

"We are particularly interested in speaking to the driver of a newly shaped Ford Puma who was in the area at the time and might be able to assist with our enquiries."







DRAFT MINUTES OF A MEETING OF HINXWORTH PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL ON THURSDAY 31st MAY 2023 AT 7.00 PM.

- I. The Minutes of the last meeting: The minutes of the meeting of 4th May were agreed by the Parish Councillors. Proposed by Dick Cobb and seconded by Tony Dawson.
- 2. Matters arising not elsewhere on the Agenda. Nothing to report.
- 3. Correspondence: Hertfordshire County Council- Rural Strategic Plan The Councillors will review this complex document and the appropriate response will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting.
- 4. Finance: Current Parish Council Funds: The Councillors agreed to the expenditure for the current month. Proposed by Dick Cobb and seconded by Tony Dawson.

Accounts 2022/2023: The Accounts are with the external auditor and will be returned for signing off at the next Parish Council meeting on July $6 \mathrm{th}$.

5. Planning: Planning Consultations:

Application 23/01161/LBC Corner Cottage, Chapel Street. The Parish Council has no objection to this and therefore supports the application.

6. Highways:

Ashwell Road:- The vegetation along the road on the right hand side going towards Ashwell, from the church to Cuckoo Corner, requires cutting back as a matter of urgency. At present it is difficult for two vehicles coming in opposite directions to pass each other safely. This could leading to a somewhat dangerous situation. Steve Jarvis is to be notified.

Traffic Calming Feasibility Study: It is hoped that the first stages (verge gates) of the calming measures in the High Street should start in this financial year. However, we are still awaiting the revised proposals, so the necessary public consultations can be planned. Action on Steve Jarvis to report back to the Councillors regarding the current situation.

- 7. Village Hall: Nothing to report.
- 8. Recreation Ground: Five-a-side football: The Chairman has been approached regarding the possibility of five-a-side football taking place on a Sunday morning at the Recreation Ground. Unfortunately, this is not possible as at present the Archery Club have an annual agreement to use the Ground on a Sunday morning.
- 9. The Tennis Court: The Net Posts: Bob Scales and Dick Cobb plan to install the new net posts on Saturday June 3rd .The Councillors would like to thank Bob Scales for his help.
- 10. Allotments: The Allotment Group: The Parish Councillors discussed the sustainability of the allotments going forward as it is now thirteen years since the Allotment Group was set up. It has been agreed the Allotment Group at their next planned Committee meeting should come forward with suggestions of how they see the way forward and what is required to make this viable and productive. The Parish Councillors look forward to the proposals in due course.
