Reminder to be vigilant when using online selling sites

Police in North Hertfordshire are reminding the public to think of personal safety and security first, when considering travelling to meet someone to hand over property they have advertised for sale online. Incidents of people attempting to sell items such as mobile phones and laptops via online marketplaces and being tricked into delivering goods to thieves, have been reported in the town.

PC Thomas Wollard, from Royston Rural Safer Neighbourhood Team, said: "If you are selling items online, please do so safely." "We have had reports of victims, who sometimes have no local knowledge about the location they are visiting, arriving at an arranged meet up point, handing over goods to potential purchasers for examination and the offenders running off with the item without paying for it. "If you use online selling sites please exercise caution, especially in circumstances where payment has not been made in advance and you are asked to travel to sell an item."

It is recommended to look at the buyer's profile to check their history and that they have genuine details. If you are arranging to meet someone to sell or buy an item, always meet in a busy public place covered by CCTV – check the location on a trusted mapping service if the buyer suggests it to check it is not isolated or unsuitable looking – and take someone else with you. Also be wary of people who offer to pay over the odds for an item. Many people use these sites to buy goods at a reduced price so, if an offer sounds too good to be true, it usually is. If you have any suspicions or concerns about the person you are dealing with, walk away.

Many of our listeners find that by using this service they feel less isolated and more involved and look forward to receiving their Talking News each week and hearing the regular friendly voices of our readers. Our readers enjoy reading to you and you will get to know them week by week.

Vicky Scales (pictured left) told us that they had collected 4 bags full of rubbish, just in one morning...



- I. The Minutes of the last meeting: The minutes of the meeting of 2nd March were agreed by the Parish Councillors. Proposed by Nick Tiffin and seconded by Tony Dawson.
- 2. Matters arising not elsewhere on the Agenda. Nothing to report.
- 3. Correspondence: Nothing to report.
- 4. Finance: Current Parish Council Funds: The Councillors agreed to the expenditure for the current month. Proposed by Dick Cobb and seconded by Tony Dawson.

The accountants responsible for overseeing the Smaller Authorities (England).

5. Planning: Planning Consultations:

Application 23/00441/S73: Farrowby Farm, New Inn Road. The Parish Council has received a decision notice regarding this application.
