

On The Beat

Keep your vehicle secure this spring. Drivers are being advised to make sure their cars and vans are secure following an increase in thefts of and from vehicles in the county. Thefts of vehicles have increased by nearly 22 per cent this year and thefts from vehicles have also increased by more than eight per cent this year, compared to the same period last year.*

Most of the items stolen were left in vehicles whilst they were unattended, or thefts of catalytic converters, which are still being targeted for the precious metals they contain.

Detective Superintendent Nev Hanks, said: "Many of the thefts reported occurred when the vehicles were left unlocked, so leaving valuable items on display in a vehicle will encourage opportunistic thieves to check if a vehicle is secure. Removing any items which may encourage a thief, such as bags, boxes, coats or loose change is an easy way to make your vehicle safer. I would also urge the public to follow our advice, remain vigilant and report suspicious incidents in their neighbourhood, particularly where people are trying to get under cars in public car parks or on public roads. If you see this happening, please call 999 immediately."

- Suspect all waste carriers. Don't let them take your rubbish until they provide proof of registration. Note their vehicle's registration plate
- Check that a waste carrier is registered on the Environment Agency's website
- Refuse any unexpected offers to have your rubbish taken away
- Ask how your rubbish will be disposed of seek evidence of this



Paperwork must be obtained: a proper invoice, waste-transfer note or receipt, including a description of the waste being removed and the waste carrier's contact details.

Friends of St Nicholas



A new chapter in the life of our 700-year-old parish church begins today with the relaunch of The Friends of St Nicholas – a group of villagers dedicated to raising money to maintain this historic building.

The move follows an amazing fund-raising campaign to pay for much-needed repairs to the church which, had the work not been carried out, would have almost certainly led to its closure on safety grounds.

Thanks to the generosity of local residents and grants secured by various church organisations the work, costing an estimated £141,000, is almost complete, although there is still a shortfall of around £13,000.

Essential work has been carried out to repair the leaking roof, the stone parapet and crumbling south window which holds up the bell tower.



Now that the most urgent work has been carried out, Hinxworth Parochial Church Council is determined to ensure that the fabric of the building it is protected for future generations and has further work planned which will be ongoing and is currently unfunded.

To this end they are reviving the Friends of St Nicholas, a body of supporters whose regular contributions helped pay for the upkeep of the church in the past.

The idea sprang from a suggestion at Hinxworth's Annual Parish Meeting when Geoff Burrows, a church warden, appealed to villagers to help safeguard the future of the building.

The Church of St Nicholas dates back to the early 14th Century and its upkeep has always been the responsibility of the village. In the Eighties a BBC radio appeal by the author and former Hinxworth resident Monica Dickens raised enough to restore the bells and tower.

Later, Gordon Hayden raised funds through the Friends of St Nicholas and, more recently, the Oak Room was built thanks to fund-raising by Eric Sore and the late Barry Huber.


Geoff Burrows said: "St Nicholas is the soul of our village and most people are unaware that the upkeep is the responsibility of the village alone. There is no other source of income. The church was built 500 years before the Battle of Trafalgar. It was built by villagers and has always been maintained by villagers. This is the most prosperous era in those 700 years and we cannot allow it to fall into disrepair. If finances remain as they are the church will eventually have to close. No baptisms, weddings or funerals."

NOTES FROM OUR MARCH MEETING

We are now fully staffed in our admin department. We are also in a very good position regarding medical staff. We enjoy the services of 4 permanent GPs plus a regular locum doctor and a Physician's Assistant. In addition we have 2 Registrars (qualified doctors who are completing their GP training). We also have a nurse and 2 Health Care Assistants. This should be good news concerning appointments and is reassuring in these times when health professionals are in such short supply nationally.

We are currently processing the results of our survey about appointments. This produced 369 completed returns which have produced a wealth of data about patient preferences. The next stage will be to produce a commentary and an action plan. Not surprisingly a major criticism arising from the survey was the telephone system which, as patients and staff agree, is not fit for purpose. However there have been some technical improvements recently which we hope will enable the queue to move quicker and avoid people being cut off. If patients experience issues with the system please let the surgery know stating your name, phone number, type of incident and date/time so we can pass on specific details to the phone company. In the meantime we are still awaiting possible news about funding for a new system from the NHS.

Elections are taking place across England on 4 May. Did you know that to vote at a polling station you will now need ID? Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence photocard; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.
